Single ticket— \$8.00 for ages 6 and over Free for age 5 and under

Monday: **Veteran's Day**—Free gate admission all day to Veterans with proper identification.

Tuesday: Senior Day – Free gate admission all day to Seniors 65 and over

Wednesday: Youth Day—From 8 a.m.—5 p.m. youth up to and including 11 years old will receive free admission to the fair.

Sunday: **First Responder's Day**—Free gate admission all day to Medina County First Responders (police, fire, EMT) with proper identification.

Sunday: Sensory Day—From Noon-2 p.m., the lights and loud music will not be played to help our fair goers with sensitivity.

Fair Office Hours are 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. The office will be open Saturday, July 20 from 9 a.m. to 4p.m. for entry registration deadline, which is July 20, 2024 by 4 p.m. All entries are to be in place by Monday, July 29 at 8 a.m. Sunday is the day for bringing projects and setting up booths. Fair officially opens Monday at 8 a.m. Gates open at 8 a.m. daily. Membership Ticket: \$35—seven (7) admissions for Medina County residents, 18 years of age or older. Season Ticket: \$35—seven (7) admissions. Mini Ticket: \$16—two (2) admissions for individuals placing entries into fair only.

Membership tickets go off sale the Sunday before the fair begins. Mini tickets are on sale in the Fair Office for those making entries and go off sale July 20 at 4 p.m. Season tickets go off sale Monday the first day of fair at 9 p.m.

Livestock Entries and all other Open Class entries CLOSE on JULY 20 at 4p.m. Entries will be accepted on a first come, first serve basis, until pen or stall space is filled and not later than 4 p.m. on July 20. **All mail in entries must be postmarked by July 13, 2024.** NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER THIS DATE.

No exhibitor will receive their strips of admission tickets until they sign the waiver on the entry form and pay for their entries. There will be NO add on entries taken over the phone. If you wish to add on to your entries, you must come into the office to do so before July 20 at 4 p.m. and fill out a new entry form and sign the waiver. Entry tags for Open Class entries are to be picked up from the Fair Office before checking in entries to the proper buildings. Tags will be ready Thursday, July 25, 2024.

Entry ownership of livestock can be established by one or all of the following means: Registration papers for dairy, beef, horse, sheep and dairy goats (see individual department rules for exceptions), bill of sale or affidavit of person swearing that they are the owner.

Any request for early release from the fair must be written and a copy of the completed state or county fair entry form must accompany the request at the time Medina County Fair entries are made. Medina County Fair has established a \$50 protest fee. All protests for Open class livestock must be submitted in writing within one hour of the show. All other protests schedules will be set by the various committees. The protest must be filed by an exhibitor from that show. If the protest is valid, the protestor will get a refund. If the protest is invalid, the money becomes the property of the MCAS.

Any Open class premiums must be picked up at the Fair Office by August 30, 2024. Premiums will be available after 8 p.m. the last day of the fair at the On Grounds office, Bldg. #14. Any premium not picked up by August 30, 2024, will be deemed and declared forfeited for the use of the Society. No premiums will be mailed. Fair Office hours after fair week will be 9 a.m. –4 p.m. Monday through Friday, except the Monday after the fair, August 5, 2024. THE FAIR OFFICE WILL BE CLOSED AND ALL EMPLOYEES WILL HAVE THE MONDAY AFTER FAIR OFF (August 5, 2024).

- 4. Misrepresentation as to breeding or ownership of animals and irregularity or violation of rules in showing, will be exposed and any premium won by such exhibitor or agents will be forfeited. If payment to exhibitor has been made before evidence is given that such violations have occurred, the exhibitor must refund premium money so forfeited or be barred from exhibition at the Medina County Fair in the future.

- 1. Exhibitor must show cattle that are 100% beef breed.
- There must be five registered animals of a breed to show as a breed. Less than five show would default to Any Other Breed. Less than 5 Any Other Breed would default to as Cross Breed. Registration papers must be available for inspection. NO HORNS or SCURS.
- 3. Fair Board will furnish tie stalls ONLY. Any other items or materials will be furnished by the Exhibitor.
- 4. Limit of four (4) animals exhibited in a class by any Exhibitor.
- 5. Show order by breed will be announced before the show.
- 6. "Competition in the Polled Hereford and/or Hereford shows is open to any animal registered in the American Polled Hereford Association and/or the American Hereford Association registries recognized by the World Hereford Council."
- 7. Any animal may be shown in a breed class or Cross Breed class but not in both. Any animal that shows in the first show cannot show in the second show.
- 8. Any animal shown in a breeding class cannot be shown in the prospect feeder class.
- 9. Entries will be accepted after the Premium Entry Book is published on a first come, first serve basis until stall space is filled, but no later than 4:00 p.m. on July 20.
- 10. All animals housed (stalled) but not shown in a class will be charged a fee of \$2.00 per day.
- 11. All animals must show in individual classes.

- 1 large egg
- ½ teaspoon pure vanilla extract

Filling

- Berry Jam either store bought or homemade approximately 12-16oz. depending upon taste or brand. Could be more.

Instructions

1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees F. Line a 9x13 pan with foil or parchment, and butter or spray with non-stick spray.

For the crust and topping

- Using a hand mixer or stand mixer fitted with the paddle attachment, combine granulated sugar, baking powder, flour, and salt. Add lemon zest, butter, egg, and vanilla. Beat on low speed until the butter is evenly distributed in small pieces and mixture is crumbly.
- Dump a little more than half of the mixture into the bottom of the prepared pan. Use your hand or the bottom of a measuring cup to evenly press the dough into the pan.

Filling

Spread the filling over the crust, then crumble the remaining dough over the top of the berries.

Bake for approximately 40-45 minutes, until the top is light golden brown, and the fruit is bubbling. Transfer from the pan to a wire rack to cool completely. For the cleanest slices refrigerate before cutting.

- 7. Bottles should have nearly straight sides and a top which can be removed without tools except for a corkscrew.
- 8. Bottles should be filled within 1" or 2" of the fully installed top or cork and must not be overfilled.
- 9. Wines should be clear and free of flotation particles (not cloudy).
- 10. Table wine should be free of effervescence.
- 11. Any wine considered unfit will not be judged.

Bob showed his level of commitment by picking them up every morning and taking them home every night. Bob would spend the day with them on the grounds making sure they had everything they needed to complete their work. Clean restrooms are always important wherever families go for entertainment, and fairgrounds are no exception. Bob has chaired the Restroom Committee for many years, making sure we hire and retain people that will get the job done.

The Medina County Fair has always been known for its Demo Derbies. From the number of cars, the level of competition, safety procedures, inspections, and rules, that all work together to create a great show. The demo derbies have routinely been some of our highest attended events. The reputation that exists today, is due in large part to the work of Bob Dreher and his longtime friend Jack Maxwell. Together they built a tremendous program. It is without a doubt that Bob's "Can do" attitude comes from his service as a Navy Seabee in Vietnam. While exposure to Agent Orange has created several health issues and slowed Bob down, but it has not stopped him. Although it takes more effort, you can still count on him to be in his seat for board meetings. We are truly blessed to have Robert "Bob" Dreher on the Medina County Fair Board.



FAQ for the Medina County Fair

- The Medina County Fair accepts cash or credit cards for payment to purchase admission tickets to the fair and grandstands.
- There is parking available off Smith Road and Lafayette Road, if you park on our grounds it is free. There are local businesses that provide parking for a donation.
- Handicap parking is available by the Community Center (off Lafayette Road) or at the Fair Office (off Smith Road)

Please follow the flow of traffic for parking.

- Majority of food vendors accept cash only for payment. If credit card is accepted, they will have it posted in their window or by their register.
- There are 3 ATMs locations on the grounds. Bldg. #22, in the Community Center & at the Fair Office.
- Fair Gates open at 8 a.m. and close at 11 p.m. daily.
- Pit passes are the same price no matter the age of the person, no matter what.
- You may bring in outside food but no glass or alcoholic beverages.
- Alcohol from the Beer Garden can only be consumed in the Beer Garden itself or in the grandstand during the event, you cannot freely roam the fairgrounds with it. Beer from the garden will be permitted on the track for the concert and OSTPA. Food is permitted in the Beer Garden and grandstand.

- Ride tickets/wristbands can be purchased at the little ticket booths all around the rides area, it is a separate fee from entering the fairgrounds or going to an event in the grandstand.
- First-Aid and Safety is located at Bldg. #26 next to the Rabbit Barn #25 near the tractor display triangle. Security is located at Bldg. #24 right across from First Aid.
- Lost & Found is located at Security Bldg. #24, the Announcers Booth under the grandstand #19 or the Fair Office #1.
- Strollers and wagons are permitted on the grounds, they are not permitted in the grandstands, you may leave them at the bottom of the grandstands.
- There is no smoking or e-cigarettes permitted in the grandstands or in the buildings/barns.
- Any Jr. Fair/4-H related questions go to the 4-H on grounds office Bldg. #11.
- The Fair Office is open 9 a.m.-9 p.m. during the week of fair, the office is closed the Monday after fair every year.
- There is no charge after 8 p.m. on the last day of fair.
- Fireworks on the last day of fair typically start around 10 p.m. and they are free to attend in the grandstand.
- There are no refunds or exchanges on items purchased from the Medina County Fair, this includes admission tickets or grandstand event tickets. All requests for refunds must be submitted in writing and send to medinafair@gmail.com.

- *Each person entering must purchase a ticket along with paying the proper premiums due for the animal(s) being entered. Pre-registration is required by all ages.
- *There are some departments that have exemptions for purchasing a ticket, please make sure you read through all the rules and classes before entering.




*If you are age 11 and under and plan to enter into still exhibits, you may go off your parent/grandparent/legal guardian's ticket when they enter. If a parent/grandparent/legal guardian is not entering then the child must purchase a ticket. This is for still exhibits **ONLY**. Pre-registrations is required by all.

- *If you cannot pick up your entries and premiums the last day of fair, everything should be at the Fair Office starting Tuesday, August 6 (the Fair Office will be closed Monday, August 5). Premiums for open class is available for pick up until August 30, 2024. After this date, the premiums will revert back to the MCAS.
