ENTRIES MUST BE MADE THROUGH FAIR ENTRY.

PROCEDURE FOR ENTERING PROJECTS:

Pre-registration is necessary along with purchasing a Membership (County residents ONLY), Season or 2 single gates. Please pick up tags and strings at the Fair Office before taking projects to Building #21. Upon receiving tags, check to make sure there is a tag for each item. If a tag is missing, report it to the Fair Office immediately. Take tags and entered items to the department during the specified times. **Have ALL tags ATTACHED (tied or scotch taped) to items so they are ready for entry when you arrive. DO NOT tear off bottom portion of tag, a committee member will do this at entry.**

ENTRY CHECK IN: Saturday, August 1 from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. in Building #21. **No entries accepted after 3:00 p.m.**

JUDGING: Saturday, August 1 at 4:30 p.m., the building WILL BE OPEN to public for judging.

DISMISSAL TIME: Sunday, August 9 from 8:00-9:00 p.m. OR Monday, August 10 from 9:00-10:00 a.m. **Please have a decision when you enter on August 1 on which dismissal time works for you as we will be handing out color coded numbers for Sunday vs. Monday at the time of entry. Exhibitors must bring numbered dismissal card received at entry AND claim tickets in order for items to be released.**

RULES:

1. Antiques will only be accepted for entry as they are listed on the pre-registry form. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**
2. Maximum number of articles is **thirty (30)** per exhibitor with no more than **fifteen (15)** articles in Glass and China categories. **One item per category per exhibitor.**
3. All articles must be at least fifty (50) years old.
4. All articles must be clean and in a good state of preservation.
5. The committee reserves the right to refuse any item entered incorrectly or in poor condition.
6. No antique dealer or their immediate family will be permitted to exhibit.
7. Any article that received a first-place ribbon last year in any category may not be entered for ONE year.
8. **NO PREMIUMS** will be given if exhibit is considered unworthy by the judge.
9. Name of exhibitor will be kept confidential.
10. All articles will be exhibited with proper protection from handling and theft. After hours, security will be provided. The management will use all reasonable care to protect the safety of the articles on exhibit but will not be responsible for any loss or breakage that may occur.
11. Decision of the judges will be final in all classes.
12. Children 11 and under are exempt from purchasing an exhibitor's ticket if the child's parent, grandparent or legal guardian has purchased a Membership, Season or 2 single gates for entering exhibits. Children do still need to pre-register as do adults.

PROCEDURE FOR ENTERING PROJECTS: Pre-registration is necessary along with purchasing a Membership (County residents ONLY), Season or 2 single gates. Please pick up tags for projects at the Fair Office. Upon receiving tags, make sure you have a tag for each project. If a tag is missing report it to the Fair Office immediately. Take tags and entered items to the department during specific times. **DO NOT ATTACH TAGS TO ITEMS. YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL TAGS FOR CORRESPONDING PROJECTS AT TIME OF ENTRY.**

JUDGING: Monday, August 3 at 9:00 a.m.

DISMISSAL: Sunday, August 9 at 8:00 p.m.

RULES:

1. Open to Professionals, Non-Professionals and Children (up to the age of 18) and will be shown and judged separately.
2. Children 11 and under are exempt from purchasing an exhibitor's ticket if the child's parent, grandparent or legal guardian has purchased a Membership, Season and 2 single gates for entering. Pre-registration is necessary for children as well as adults.
3. Any Art item that received a place ribbon last year in any category may not be entered for one year.
4. **ALL ENTRIES MUST BE FRAMED AND WIRED FOR HANGING – NO DUCT TAPED/TAPED WIRING.**
A: ABSOLUTLY NO BLACK PLASTIC POP IN FRAMES.
B: Watercolors, pastels, charcoals, pencils MUST BE UNDER GLASS and follow framing rules.
C: NO saw tooth hangers allowed.
5. **All work not properly hung/framed will NOT BE JUDGED.**
6. **Any entry not pre-registered or incorrectly registered will NOT BE JUDGED.**
7. One entry per person per listing.
8. All articles must be brought in at own risk and Department is not responsible for articles.
9. Children (age 14-18) are allowed to enter Children's Art as well as Non-Professional Adult Art, but they will be judged with adults in those classes, and there is still a limit of one entry per class.
10. **PROFESSIONAL**—Someone who is paid to paint or sells their paintings.
NON-PROFESSIONAL—Someone who isn't quite to the level of Professional, does painting as hobby and still perfecting their craft.
CHILDREN'S ART—Child—18 years of age individuals who paint.
