ADMISSIONS

Single ticket— \$8.00 for age 6 and over

Free for age 5 and under

Monday: Veterans Day—Free gate admission all day to Veterans with proper identification.

Tuesday: Senior Day – Free gate admission all day to Seniors 65 and over.

Wednesday: Youth Day—From 8 a.m.—5 p.m. youth up to and including 11 years old will receive free admission to the fair.

Thursday: Patriotic Day – Show off your Red, White, and Blue!

Friday: Sensory Friendly Day – From 10 a.m.-2 p.m. there will be sensory friendly activities in the Pavilion as well as the lights and loud music will not be played on the grounds.

Saturday: Family Day – Plan a day to make memories with the family at the fair!

Sunday: First Responders Day—Free gate admission all day to Medina County First Responders (police, fire, EMT) with proper identification.

Sunday: From Noon-2 p.m., the lights and loud music will not be played to help our fair goers with sensitivity.

Fair Office Hours are 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. The office will be open Saturday, July 18 from 9 a.m. to 2p.m. for entry registration. Open Class Entry Deadline is Monday, July 20, 2025, by 4 p.m. All entries are to be in place by Monday, August 3 at 8 a.m. Sunday is the day for bringing projects and setting up booths. Fair officially opens Monday at 8 a.m. Gates open at 8 a.m. daily.

Membership: \$42—seven (7) admissions for Medina County residents, 18 years of age or older. Memberships go off sale Sunday, August 2 at 4 p.m.

Season: \$42—seven (7) admissions. Seasons go off sale Monday, August 3 at 9 p.m.

Livestock Entries and all other Open Class entries CLOSE on JULY 20 at 4 p.m. Entries will be accepted on a first come, first serve basis, until pen or stall space is filled and not later than 4 p.m. on July 20. **All entries are to be made through Fair Entry which is an online system, if you are needing assistance, you may call the Fair Office or come in for help.** NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER JULY 20, 2026 at 4 p.m.

New Classes for 2026 will be in red and have a * by them.

No exhibitor will receive their admission tickets until they submit and pay for their entries. Entry tags for Open Class entries are to be picked up from the Fair Office before checking in entries to the proper buildings. Tags will be ready Thursday, July 30, 2026.

Entry ownership of livestock can be established by one or all of the following means: Registration papers for dairy, beef, horse, sheep and dairy goats (see individual department rules for exceptions), bill of sale or affidavit of person swearing that they are the owner. Any request for early release from the fair must be written and a copy of the completed state or county fair entry form must accompany the request at the time Medina County Fair entries are made. Medina County Fair has established a \$50 protest fee. All protests for Open class livestock must be submitted in writing or email within one hour of the show. All other protests schedules will be set by the various committees. The protest must be filed by an exhibitor from that show. If the protest is valid, the protestor will get a refund. If the protest is invalid, the money becomes the property of the MCAS.

Any Open class premiums must be picked up at the Fair Office by August 31, 2026. Premiums will be available after 8 p.m. the last day of the fair at the On Grounds office, Bldg. #14. Any premium not picked up by August 31, 2026, will be deemed and declared forfeited for the use of the Society. No premiums will be mailed. Fair Office hours after fair week will be 9 a.m. –4 p.m. Monday through Friday, except the Monday after the fair, August 10, 2026. **THE FAIR OFFICE WILL BE CLOSED AND EMPLOYEES WILL HAVE THE MONDAY AFTER FAIR OFF (August 10, 2026).**

NOTE: We will be splitting this year's dairy show. Brown Swiss and Jersey must be in place by 8:00 a.m. Mon., August 3. They will show on Wed., August 5 at 8:30 a.m. and be dismissed on Wed. evening August 5 at 9:00 p.m. Holstein, Ayrshire, Milking Shorthorn & Guernsey will be admitted between 4:00-11:00 a.m. on Thurs., August 6. Judging will be Fri., August 7 at 8:30 a.m. Dismissal will be Sun., August 9 at 8:00 p.m.

Exhibitors are allowed to stay all week but must arrive by 8:00 a.m. Monday, August 3 with a dismissal time of Sunday, August 9 at 8:00 p.m. **Please note on your entry form if you are staying all week.**

ALL CATTLE SHOWN AT THIS FAIR MUST CONFORM TO THE FOLLOWING RULES:

1. All animals must be registered in their respective herd books and the exhibitors must be prepared to produce certificates of registry anytime during the Fair.
2. Registration certificates must be recorded in the name of the exhibitor.
3. All animals must be shown in their proper class.
4. Misrepresentation as to breeding or ownership of animals and irregularity or violation of rules in showing, will be exposed and any premium won by such exhibitor or agents will be forfeited. If payment to exhibitor has been made before evidence is given that such violations have occurred, the exhibitor must refund premium money so forfeited or be barred from exhibition at the Medina County Fair in the future.
5. All cattle must be free of disease.
6. Stalls will be assigned before arrival at the Fairgrounds.
7. Exhibitors will be required to have their respective areas cleaned by 10:00 a.m. each day and kept clean throughout the day.
8. Each exhibitor is limited to two premiums per class.
9. ALL ANIMALS IN OPEN CLASS BARNES SHALL ABIDE BY OPEN CLASS RULES.
10. Entries will be accepted on a first come, first serve basis until stall space is filled and not later than 4:00 p.m. on July 20.

ENTRY FEE: 10% First Place Premium per class, plus a Membership (County resident ONLY), Season or 2 single gates. Entry fee due with entry and is not refundable. No late entries accepted.

Jr. Fair MARKET STEERS/HEIFERS ONLY exempt from Membership, Season or 2 single gates.

JUDGING (First Show): Tuesday, August 4 at 8:30 a.m. for Belted Galloway, Hereford, Simmental, All Other Breeds, Cross Breed, Shorthorn, and Market Steers/Heifers. Entries must be in place Monday, August 3 by 8:00 a.m. Dismissal is Wednesday, August 5 at 9:00 p.m.

JUDGING (Second Show): Friday, August 7 at 1:00 p.m. for Angus, Cross Breed, Limousin, Lim-Flex, and All Other Breeds. Show entries will be admitted Thursday, August 6 between 4-11 a.m. Dismissal will be Sunday, August 9 at 8:00 p.m.

You must decide which All Other Breed Class or Cross Breed Class you want to show in at entry time. You can only show in one class. This will be decided at entry time.

RULES:

1. Exhibitor must show cattle that are 100% beef breed.
2. There must be five registered animals of a breed to show as a breed. Less than five show would default to All Other Breed. Less than five Any Other Breed would default to as Cross Breed. **Registration papers must be available for inspection. NO HORNS or SCURS.**
3. Fair Board will furnish tie stalls ONLY. Any other items or materials will be furnished by the Exhibitor.
4. Limit of four (4) animals exhibited in a class by any Exhibitor.
5. Show order by breed will be announced before the show.
6. "Competition in the Polled Hereford and/or Hereford shows is open to any animal registered in the American Polled Hereford Association and/or the American Hereford Association registries recognized by the World Hereford Council."
7. Any animal may be shown in a breed class or Cross Breed class but not in both. Any animal that shows in the first show cannot show in the second show.
8. Entries will be accepted after the Fair Book is published on a first come, first serve basis until stall space is filled, but no later than 4:00 p.m. on July 20.
9. All animals housed (stalled) but not shown in a class will be charged a fee of \$2.00 per day.
10. All animals must show in individual classes.
11. Bulls over 8 months of age must have ring or nose lead and halter.
12. Jr. Fair animals **MUST** house with Jr. Fair.
13. The Fair Board Directors in charge of the Open Class Beef Cattle Dept. shall reserve the right to have the final jurisdiction over any and all questions and disputes in the Open Class Beef Cattle Dept.
14. All stalls will be assigned before arrival at the fairgrounds.
15. All registered cattle will abide by the rules set forth in their respective breed association for purebred percentages.
16. Exhibitors must have the **original registration certificate** on each animal available for inspection before the shows. Ear tattoos **must be legible** and correspond to the registration certificate.
17. Exhibitors may be allowed to stay all week if space is available but must arrive by 8:00 a.m. Monday, August 3 with a dismissal time of Sunday, August 9 at 8:00 p.m. **MUST NOTE ON ENTRY FORM IF STAYING ALL WEEK is desired. Approval will be granted after July 20.**

- 1 package (1/4 oz.) active dry yeast
- ¼ cup warm water (110-115 degrees)
- 1 cup warm 2% milk (110-115 degrees)
- ½ cup sugar
- ½ cup butter, softened
- 1 large egg, room temperature
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 4-1/2 to 5 cups all-purpose flour

Filling

- 2 cans (16 oz. each) pitted tart cherries, well drained and roughly chopped
- ½ cup all-purpose flour
- ½ cup packed brown sugar
- ½ cup chopped pecans

Icing

- 1 cup confectioners’ sugar
- ¼ teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 to 2 tablespoons 2% milk

Instructions

1. In a large bowl, dissolve yeast in warm water. Add the milk, sugar, butter, egg, salt and 2 cups flour. Beat until smooth. Stir in enough remaining flour to form a soft dough.
2. Turn onto a lightly floured surface; kneed until smooth and elastic, 6-8 minutes. Place in a greased bowl, turning once to grease top. Cover and refrigerate overnight.
3. Line 2 baking sheets with parchment; set aside. Punch down dough. Turn onto a lightly floured surface; divide in half. Roll each portion into a 14x7-in. rectangle. Spread cherries over dough to within ½ in. of edges. Combine the flour, brown sugar and pecans, sprinkle over cherries.
4. Roll up each rectangle jelly-roll style, starting with a long side; pinch seams and tuck ends under. Place each seam side down on a prepared baking sheet; pinch ends together to form a ring. With kitchen scissors, cut from outside edge two-thirds of the way toward center of ring at 1-in. intervals. Separate strips slightly and twist to allow filling to show. Cover and let rise until doubled, about 1 hour.
5. Bake at 350 degrees until golden brown, 20-25 minutes. Remove from pans to wire racks.

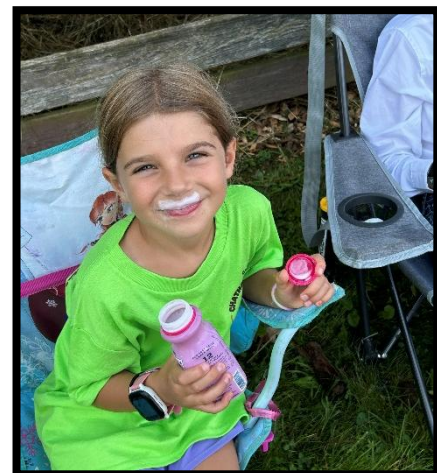

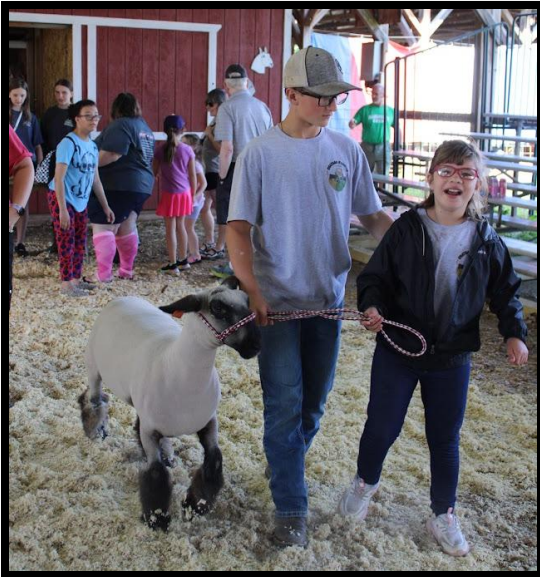

FAQ for the Medina County Fair

- The Medina County Fair accepts cash or credit cards for payment to purchase admission tickets to the fair and grandstands.
- There is parking available off Smith Road and Lafayette Road, if you park on our grounds it is free. There are local businesses that provide parking for a donation.
- Handicap parking is available by the Community Center (off Lafayette Road) or at the Fair Office (off Smith Road).

Please follow the flow of traffic for parking.
- Majority of food vendors accept cash only for payment. If credit card is accepted, they will have it posted in their window or by their register.
- There are 3 ATMs locations on the grounds. Bldg. #22, in the Community Center & at the Fair Office.
- Fair Gates open at 8 a.m. and close at 11 p.m. daily.
- Pit passes are the same price no matter the age of the person, no matter what. These are sold at Gate #1 or Bldg. #14 starting at 4:00 p.m. These are the only locations to get your pit pass wristband.
- If you pre-purchased a pit pass, you must go to Gate #1 to get your wristband.
- You may bring in outside food but no glass or alcoholic beverages.
- Alcohol from the Beer Garden can only be consumed in the Beer Garden itself or in the grandstand during the event, you cannot freely roam the fairgrounds with it. Beer from the garden will be permitted on the track for the concert and OSTPA, which is ONLY in front of the Grandstands, not in the infield. Food is permitted in the Beer Garden and grandstand.
- Ride tickets/wristbands can be purchased at the little ticket booths all around the rides area, it is a separate fee from entering the fairgrounds or going to an event in the grandstand.
- First-Aid and Safety is located at Bldg. #26 next to the Rabbit Barn #25 near the tractor display triangle. Security is located at Bldg. #24 right across from First Aid.
- Lost & Found is located at Security Bldg. #24, the Announcers Booth under the grandstand #19 or the Fair Office #1.
- Strollers and wagons are permitted on the grounds, they are not permitted in the grandstands, you may leave them at the bottom of the grandstands.
- There is no smoking or e-cigarettes permitted in the grandstands or in the buildings/barns.
- Any Jr. Fair/4-H related questions go to the 4-H on grounds office Bldg. #11.
- The Fair Office is open 9 a.m.-9 p.m. during the week of fair, the office is closed the Monday after fair every year.
- There is no charge after 8 p.m. on the last day of fair.
- Fireworks on the last day of fair typically start around 10 p.m. and they are free to attend in the grandstand.
- There are no refunds or exchanges on items purchased from the Medina County Fair, this includes admission tickets or grandstand event tickets. All requests for refunds must be submitted in writing and send to medinafair@gmail.com.

How to sign up for Open Class through FairEntry



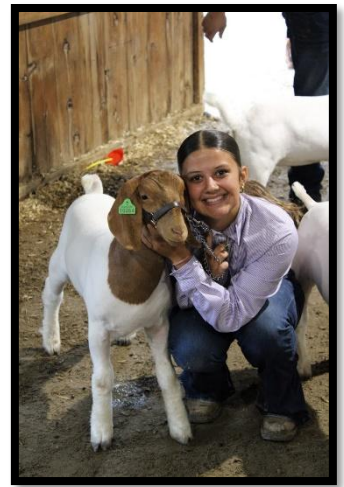
- All entries are now fully online, there will be no paper entries. We have Chromebooks in the Fair Office to help those who need assistance with signing up this year.
- You will need to make an account through the FairEntry website (find the Medina County Fair – Open Class link, it will be a photo of our fair logo)
- You will click on “As an Exhibitor” under How would you like to participate. If you already have a Fair Entry account, you may sign in, if not you would need to create an account (Please make the account in the Parent/Grandparent/Legal Guardian’s name).
- Once you have signed in or created an account you will be prompted to the Welcome screen to either start making your entries or go back to the dashboard.
- You will then register those who will fall under the Parent/Grandparent/Legal Guardian or self.
- You will be asked what ticket you will be purchasing or if you are exempt. If you mark exempt, you will be asked to state your reason.
- From here you will then work on adding your entries under that person’s name.
- Once you are finished adding in all your entries, you click on the Continue to Payment tab.
- There you will be shown what your total due is, the payment will be made through Stripe for your entries and a link to Fairs.com for you to purchase your entry tickets to finish your entry.
